Since 1988, Santa Barbara Wildlife Care Network (SBWCN) serves to rescue, rehabilitate and return to the wild sick, injured. orphaned, or oil-impaired wild birds, reptiles, amphibians, and small mammals in Santa Barbara and Ventura Counties.



Each year, **2,400** baby animals from **212** species are admitted, with operations running **365** days a year.



WILDLIFE HOSPITAL

Opened in 2022, the Wendy McCaw Wildlife Hospital is a 5,400-squarefoot facility with surgery and X-ray rooms, oiled animal wash stations. and nurseries for baby wildlife. The hospital provides a massive upgrade to SBWCN's important rehabilitation efforts.
